ANALYSIS OF EMBARKATION AND DISEMBARKATION DATA FROM
APPROVED ENTRY / EXIT POINTS

INTRODUCTION

One of the statutory functions of the Service is examination of travellers disembarking or embarking Ghana. In this view, the compiled statistics generated and the analysis of Embarkation and Disembarkation data on travellers received from all the approved Entry /Exit points were categorized into means of transport, entry / exit points and nationality.(see pages 4 -23 for details.)

It was observed that fluctuating trends were recorded for both arrival and departure, the month of July showed a positive rise in arrivals showing a percentage of 9.45% followed by August (9.21%) and December (8.76%) whilst the month of August received the highest figure for departure with a percentage of 9.56% followed by September (8.91%) and July (8.48%). This trend can be attributed to the Pan African festival that took place during the 3rd quarter and then December because of the Christmas and the general elections in the country.

SUMMARY

- A grand total of 861 539 and 881 213 arrivals and departures were recorded showing a respective positive increment of 4.11% and 3.93% over the same period last year , 2011 (827 501 / 847877 as arrival and departure respectively).
- Ghanaian travellers recorded 268 000 (31.11%) arrivals and 301 317 (34.19%) departures.
- ECOWAS national travellers registered 207 543(24.09%) as arrival and 196 796 (22.33%) as departure.
- Other (nationals) travellers recorded 385 996 (44.80%) arrival and 383 100 (43.47%) departure respectively.
- Travellers by air recorded the highest of the distribution for the period under review illustrating 765 817 (88.89%) of the total arrival and 784 706 (89.05%) of total departure followed by land with 93 601 (10.86%) arrivals and 92 838 (10.54%) departures. Finally, travelling by sea showed 2 121(0.25%) arrivals and 3 669 (0.42 %) departures respectively.
- 735 foreigners were not admitted into the country.
- 179 stowaway reports were recorded.
- A total of 1196 Ghanaians were deported from abroad showing a percentage increase of (1017) 17.60% over the same period last year while a mass deportation of 315 Ghanaians were recorded between Jan - Oct, 2012. Ghanaian deportees from Saudi Arabia, United Kingdom, Libya and Israel recorded significant values and percentages of 297(24.83%), 229 (19.15%), 221 (18.48%) and 167 (13.96%) respectively. Comparative Analysis of the Year 2012 and 2011

- A total of 861 539 and 881 213 arrivals and departures were recorded showing a respective increment of 4.11% and 3.93% over the same period last year , 2011 (827 501 / 847877 as arrival and departure respectively).
- Ghanaian travellers recorded 268 000 (31.11%) arrivals and 301 317 (34.19%) departures showing a positive change of 7.27% and 7.42% respectively for arrival and departure.
- ECOWAS national travellers registered 207 543(24.09%) as arrival and 196 796 (22.33%) as departure with a decline in value of 4.05% and 6.43% for arrival and departure.
- Other (national) travellers recorded 385 996 (44.80%) arrival and 383 100 (43.47%) departure with an increase of 6.71% and 7.03% respectively.
- Travellers by air recorded a positive change of 3.64% for arrival and 5.31% for departure
- Travelling by land also showed an increment in arrivals value but a decline in departure of 9.97% and 6.29% respectively.
- A drastic decrease was recorded by sea with a percentage of 63.88% and 11.17% for arrival and departure respectively. The percentage rise in both air and land travellers confirm that travelling by sea is becoming a thing of the past.
- In all, KIA, PAGA AND OTHER entry / exit points obtained a positive change with their respective arrival and departure percentages as follows: **KIA** 3.64% / 5.31%, **Paga** 43.78% / 42.84%, **Other** entry / exit points 21.11% / 10.66 while **Aflao** had an increase of 1.33% in arrival but a decrease of 28.68% in departure and **Elubo** recorded a decline in both arrival and departure with values of 0.31% / 2.07% respectively
- Out of the seventeen (17) selected nationalities, Nigerians, Americans and British always stand tall in both arrival and departure. Though Nigerians had the highest value in both arrival and departure a decline was recorded comparatively with the year 2011 showing a percentage decline of 2.68% / 10.21%, this was followed by American and British which had an increase of 0.75% / 4.54% and 3.78% / 3.50% respectively.
- Fraudulent reported cases and deportation of Ghanaians from Abroad increased by 10.97% and 17.60% respectively.

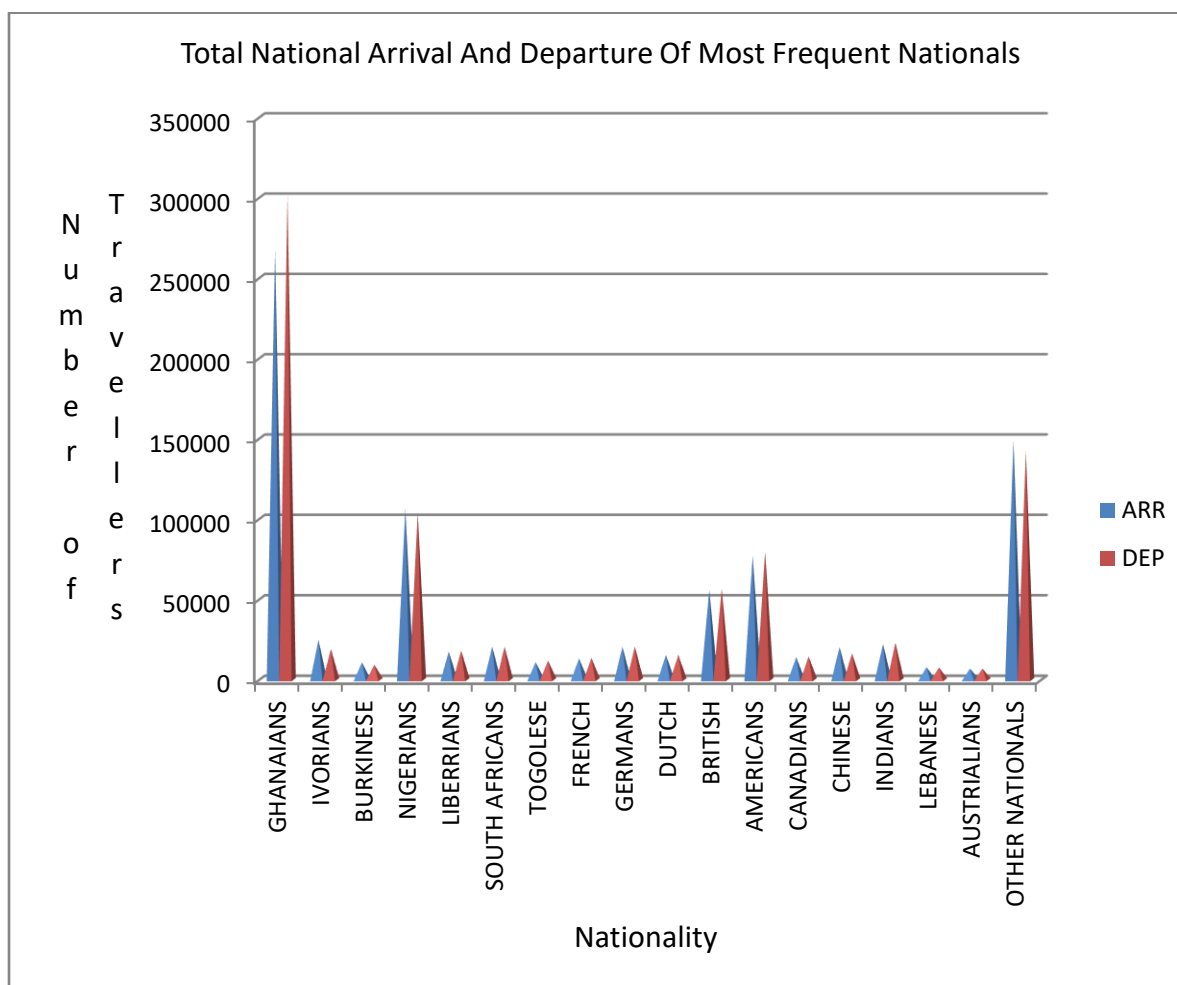

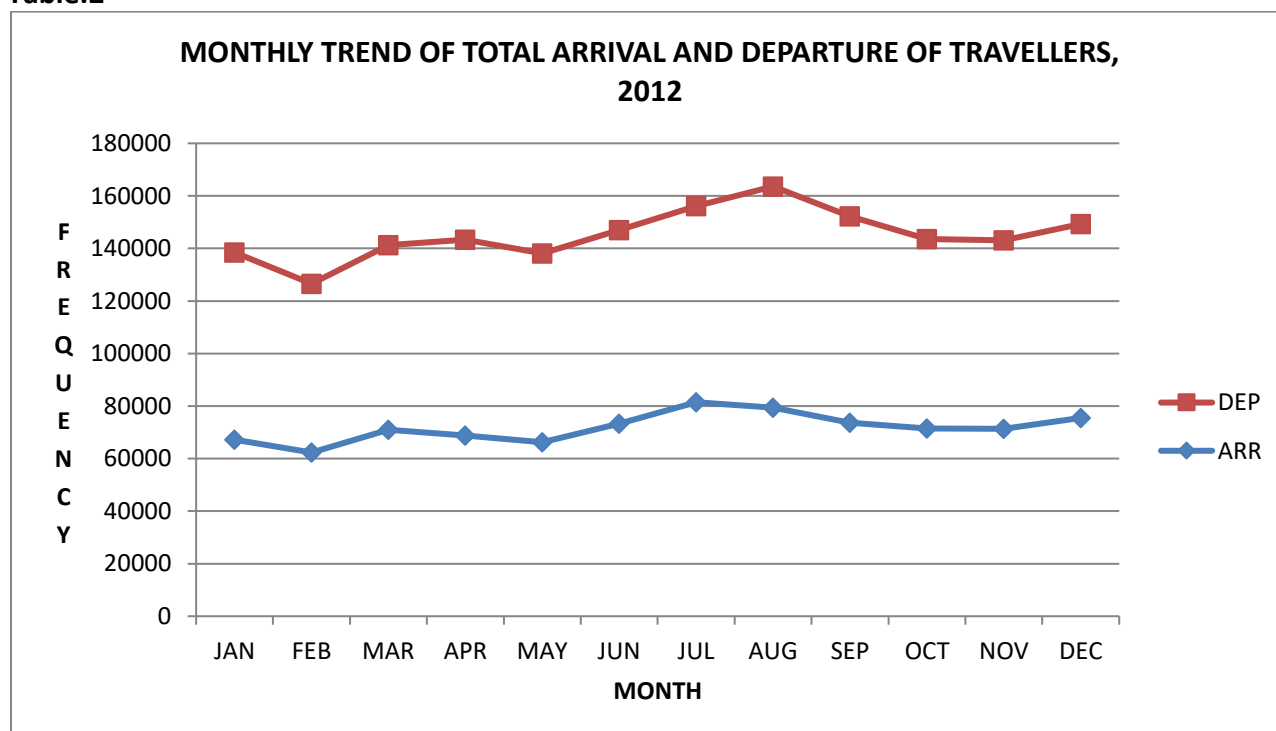

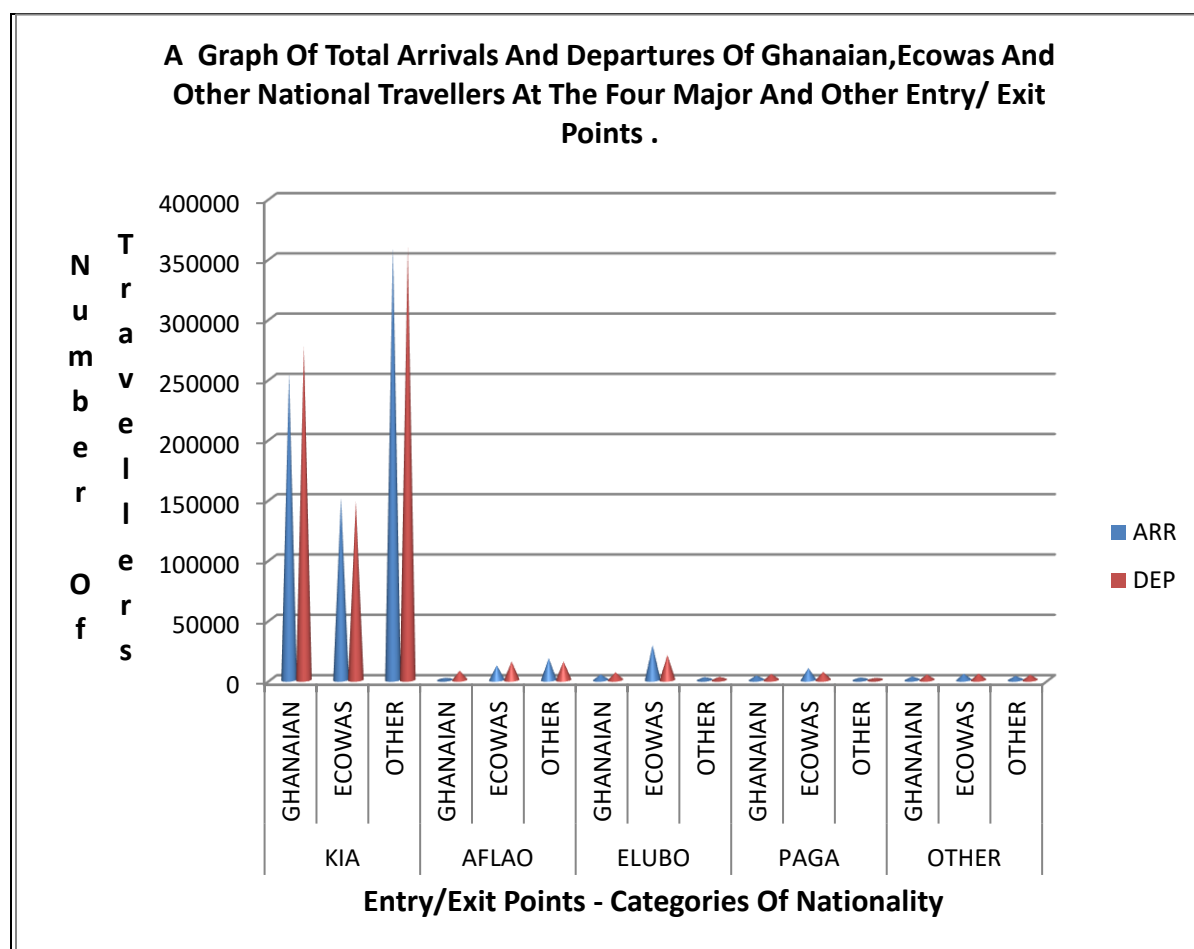

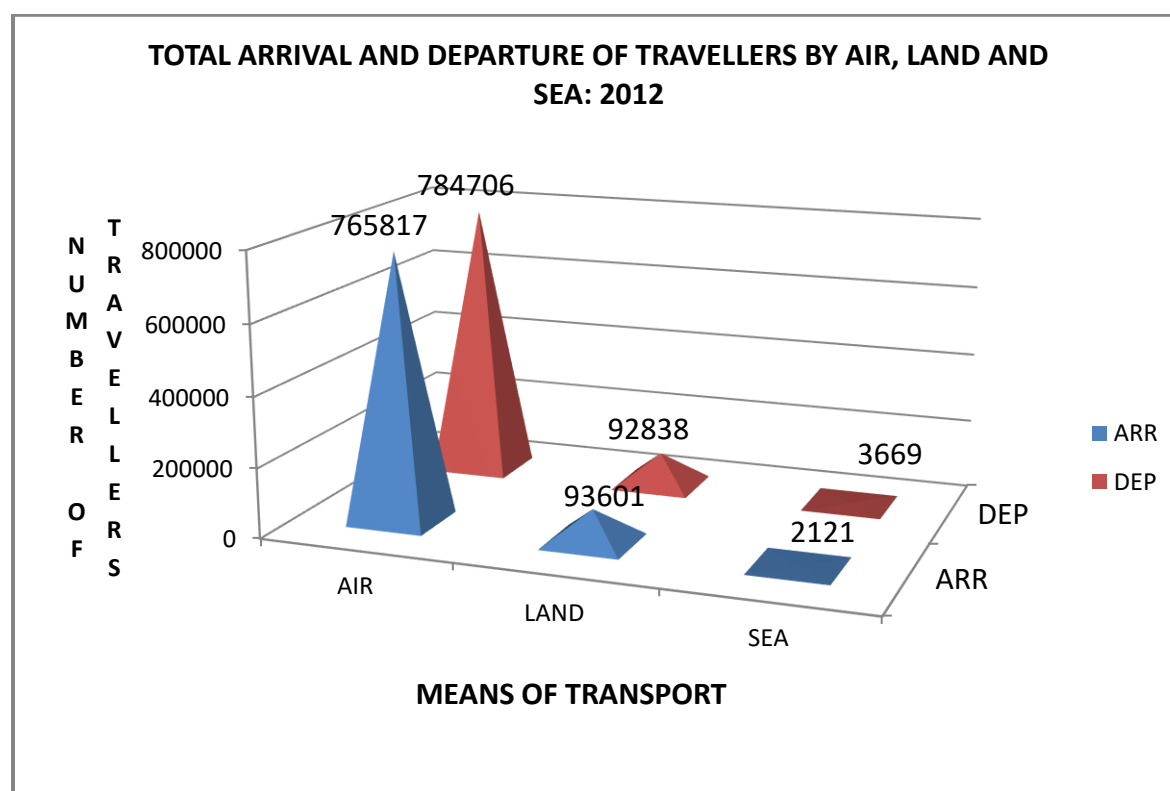

Though travelling by air is quiet expensive, most travellers prefer it to any other means of transport due to its comfort, safety, express and reliability. In all 88.49 % and 89.05% arrived and departed by air with land indicating 10.86% and 10.54% respectively for arrival and departure. Travelling by sea which always receives the least obtained 0.25% and 0.42% respectively for arrival and departure.

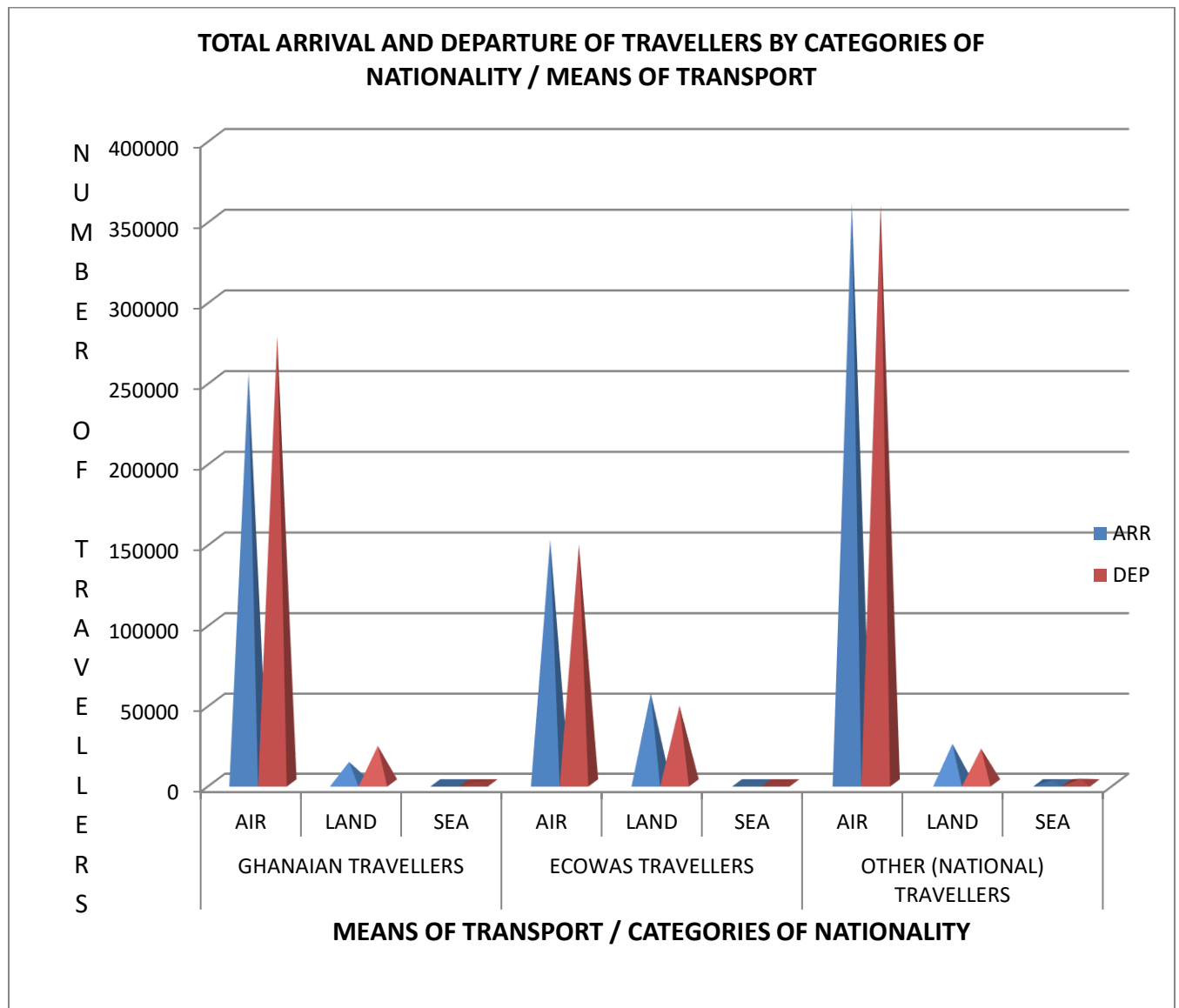

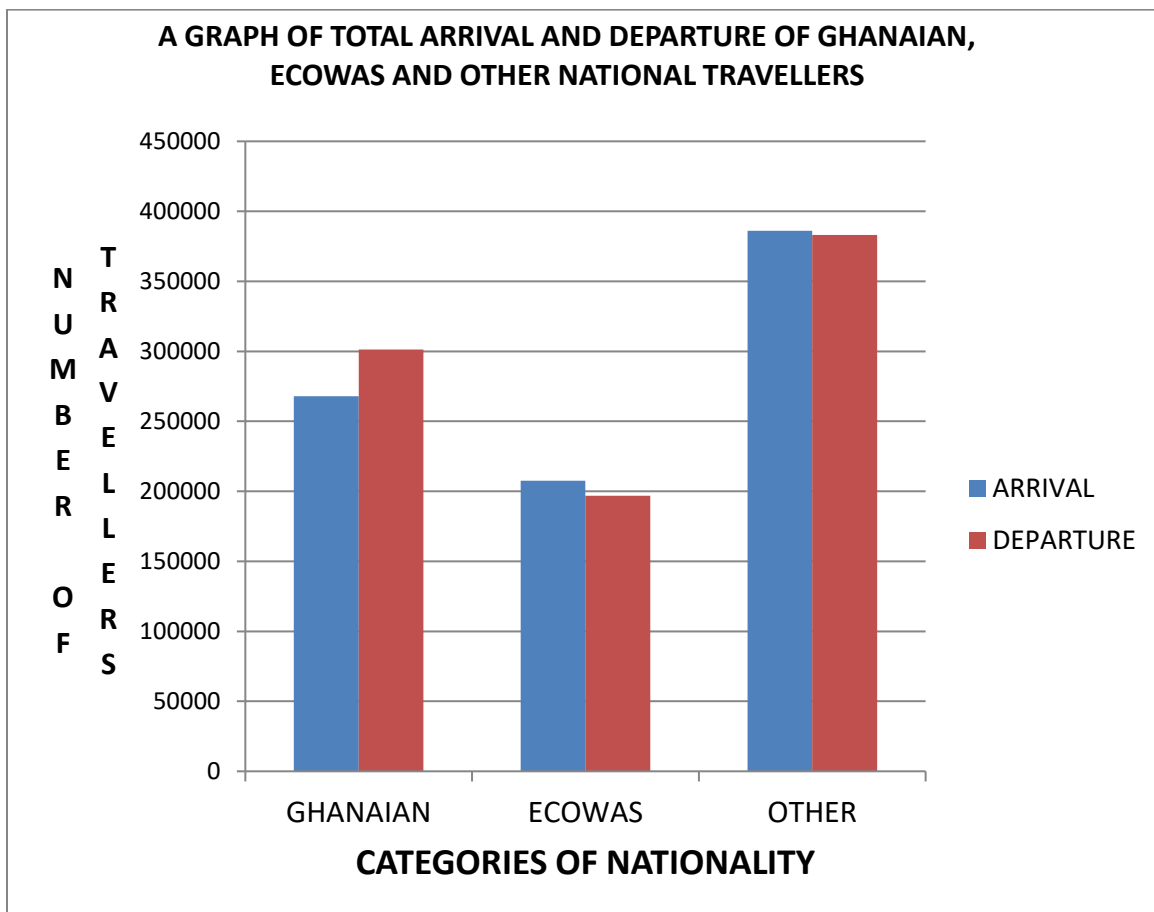

Fraudulent Cases Intercepted At K. I. A : By Quarter

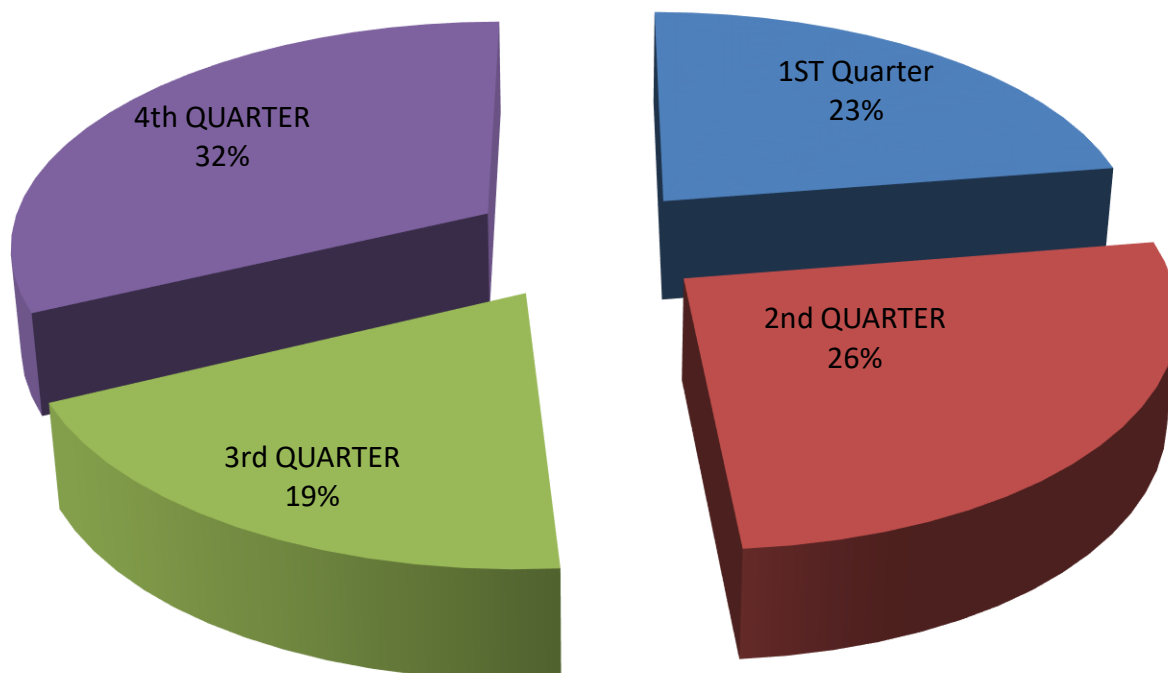

Ghanaian deportees from abroad showed a percentage increase of 17.60% over the same period last year (1017) while a mass deportation of 315 Ghanaians were recorded between Jan - Oct, 2012. Deportation from Saudi Arabia, United Kingdom, Libya and Israel recorded significant values and percentages of 297(24.83%), 229 (19.15%), 221 (18.48%) and 167 (13.96%) respectively.

QUARTERLY PROPORTION OF GHANAIAN DEPORTEES FROM ABROAD

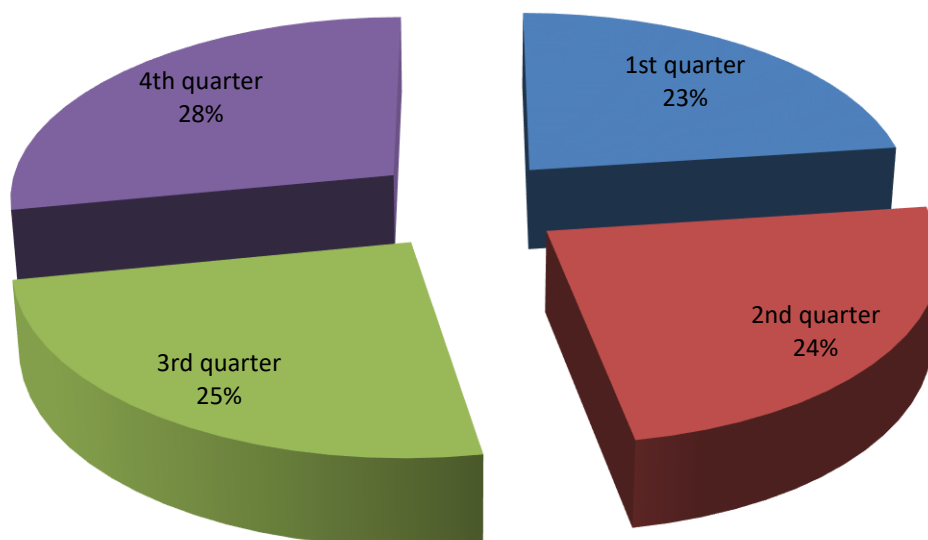

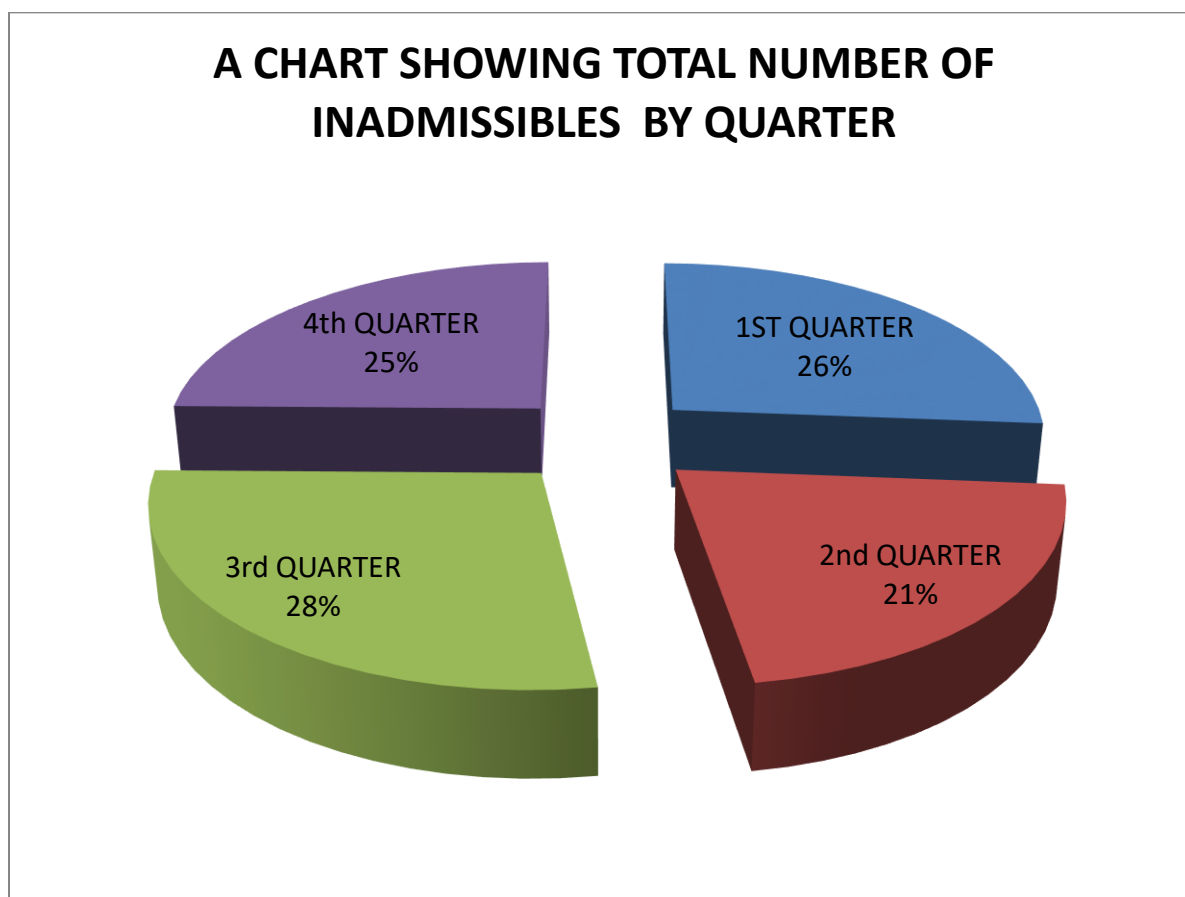

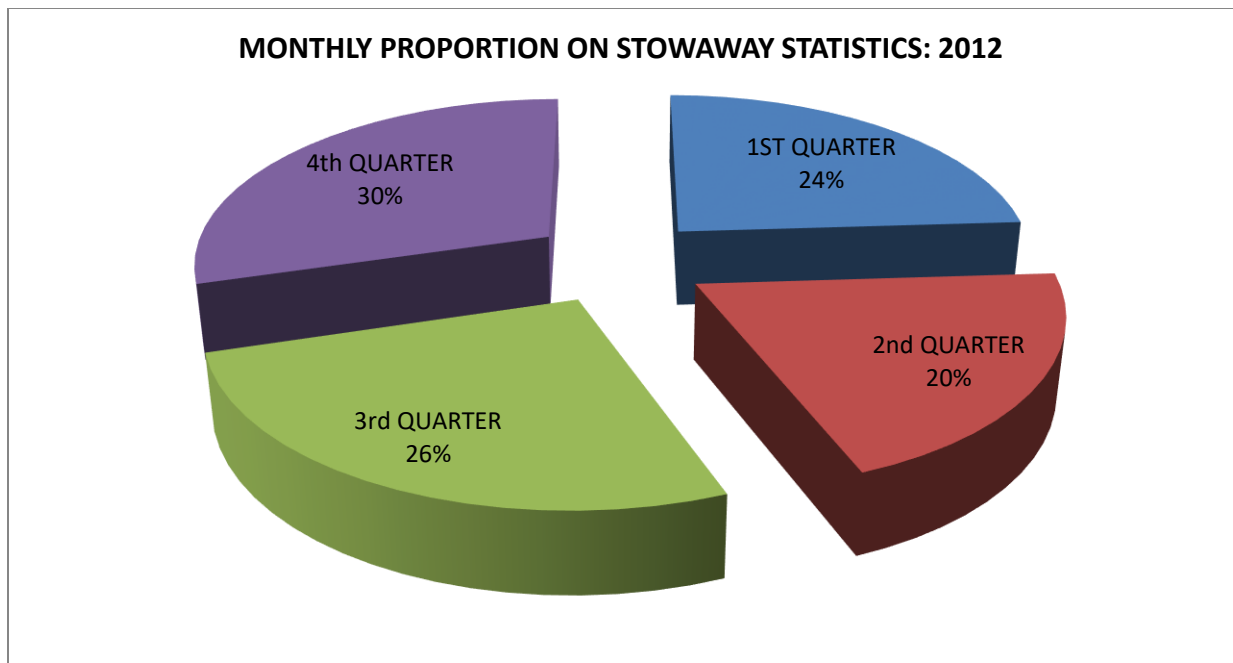

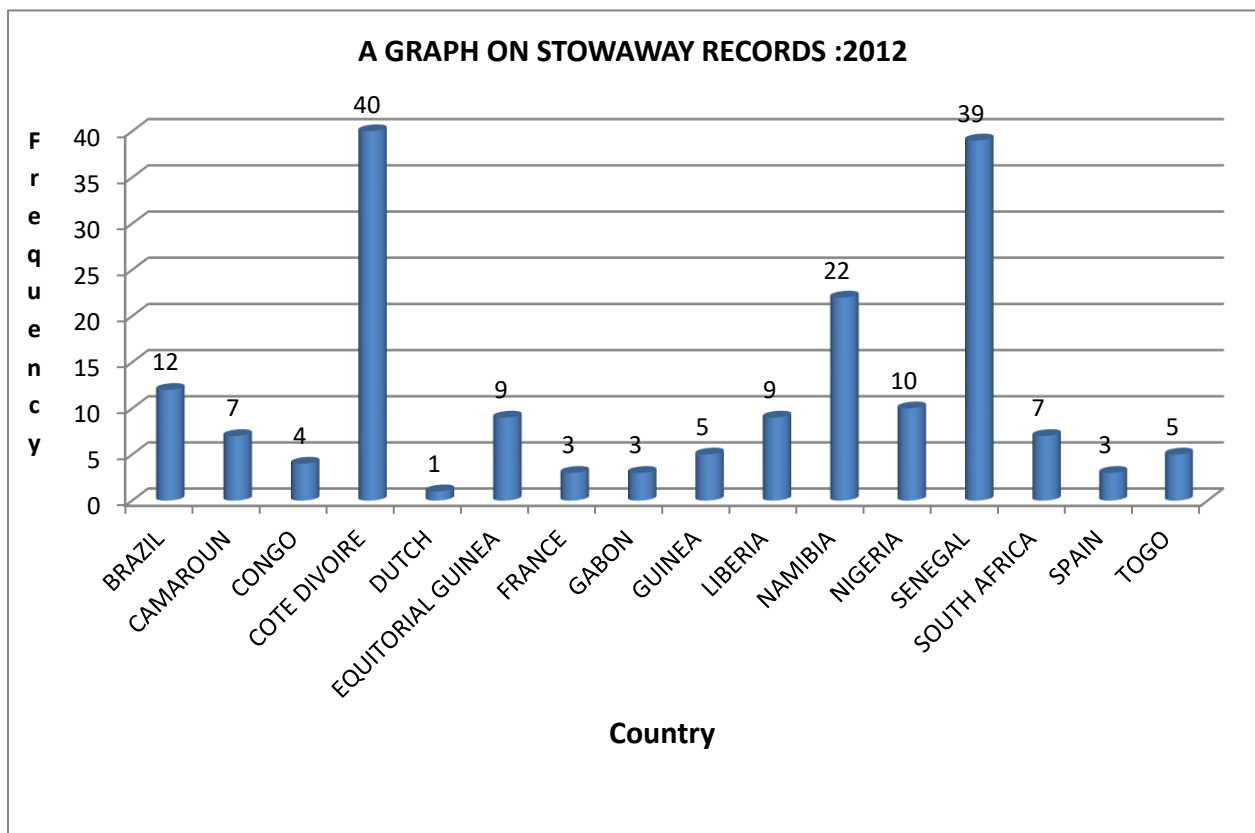
